

TREMENDOUS TRADE AT COBHAM DISPERSAL, INSIDE THE M25...

A splendid crowd of farmers and cattle buyers attended Cobham Court Farm on Wednesday this week for the dispersal of Messrs Cobham Park Farms commercial herd and range of implements and machinery. A furious trade for fresh calved and close calved animals persisted right through the day with 23 individuals making 4 figure prices with a top of 1220gns. This was paid for a daughter of Silky Gibson that had given over 7,200 kilos as a heifer and was due in July to Moet Nansen. The buyer was Mr. P Skinner from Tilsey, nr Oxted who bought several cattle in the sale. A handful of served heifers sold to a peak of 960gns and maiden heifers sold up to 600 gns. Heifer calves at foot were a strong trade averaging £367, and selling up to 440gns.

Earlier in the day a clearance of the machinery featured a 2006 MF 4455 which made £16,500 and a MF 8925 Tele Handler made over £15,000 with the attachment. A Richard Western 10 tonne capacity slurry tanker made £5,500 and amongst the dairy equipment a Dari-Kool 8500 ltr. bulk tank made £6,800.

Ten-year-old cubicles were in tremendous demand, the 200 pieces averaging out over £30.00 each.
